

As part of the Vision Zero Action Plan, we will look for ways to strengthen collaboration beyond the County departments and beyond the transportation network. For example:



**Schools generate a lot of trips.** Over 28,000 students attending 186 school days per year means high volumes of vulnerable populations in school zones.



**Arlington Public Schools** and **youth organizations** will be key partners to reach parents, teachers, and students.



**Safe mobility and accessibility are civil rights.** That is especially relevant for our neighbors who are older and those with disabilities.



The **Disability Advisory Committee** and **Commission on Aging** are important voices in this work.



A safe, accessible transportation network is the foundation for **access to economic opportunity** in Arlington.



Collaboration with the **Economic Development Commission**, **Business Improvement Districts**, and **corridor organizations** is essential.



There are many **historically under-served communities** (including immigrant and lower-income communities).



We will partner with **Arlington County Public Schools**; **Civic Associations**; **Arlington Partnership for Children, Youth, and Families**; and **other groups** to help ensure that these communities are comfortable being involved and have multiple opportunities to do so.



We will use **context-sensitive safety strategies** that take into account existing and future land uses.



The **Site Plan Review Committee** and **Housing Commission** will collaborate on connecting land use and transportation safety.
