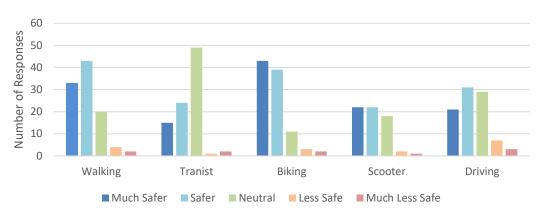
- Desire for an improved corridor connection between Potomac Yard and Crystal City for people walking and biking

Community Touchpoint - June

In June, we shared concept designs informed by April's community input. We asked you to help us evaluate the concept designs based on the project goals of increasing safety and access for all road users.

- 68% of respondents agreed or strongly agreed that the design concept would have a positive impact on how they travel along Potomac Avenue
- Most respondents also indicated that the proposed concept would make them feel safer or much safer while traveling along Potomac Avenue whether walking, biking or driving

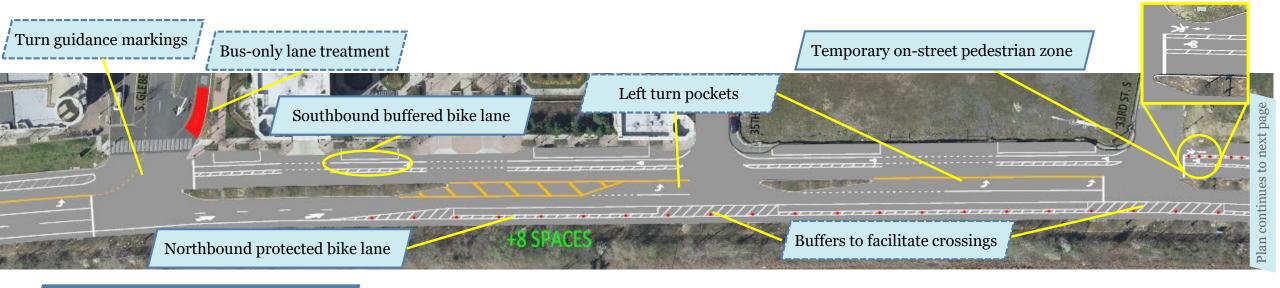

Final Concept Summary

Improvements included in concept design, informed by first round of community input

- Upgraded bike lane in both directions (protected and buffered)
- Interim pedestrian treatment between 29th St S and 33rd St S
- Adds wider parking near hotel to accommodate shuttle vehicles
- Formalizes parking and provides 81 parking spaces (47 existing)

Improvements added to final concept, informed by second round of community input

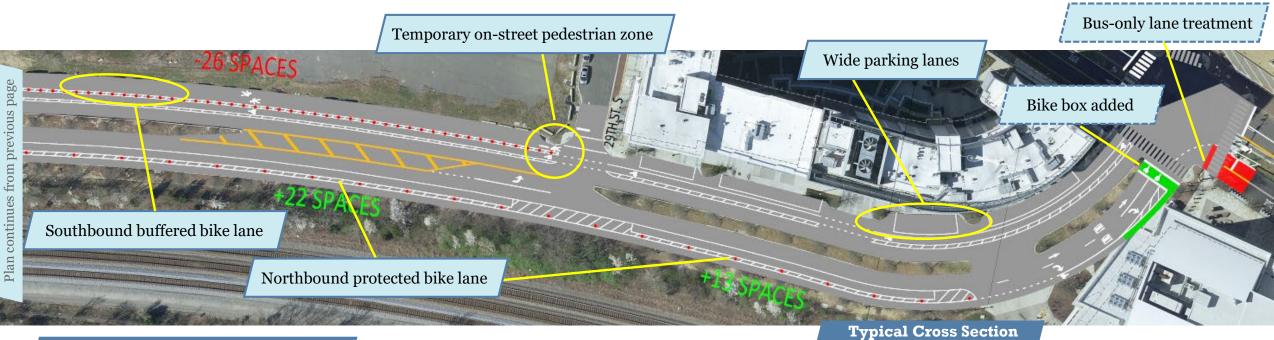
- Adds turn guidance and bus-only lane treatment (red markings) at Crystal Drive and Glebe Road to facilitate turning movements near dedicated transit lanes
- Adds a left turn pocket lane at 35 St S, 33rd St S and 29th St S
- Adds a bike box to facilitate bike movements north at Crystal Drive
- Adds buffered breaks to parking at intersections on east side of street to facilitate crossings

Construction Schedule

- Implementation scheduled to begin mid July
