

COVID-19 Diagnostic (Viral/Antigen) and Antibody Test Locations in Arlington

There are two types of COVID-19 tests—diagnostic and antibody. A **diagnostic test** shows if you have a current infection by taking a nasal or throat swab. An **antibody test** shows if you have antibodies due to a past infection by taking a blood sample. There are two types of diagnostic tests—Viral PCR and Antigen—which have different ways of detecting the virus. **Viral PCR tests** are highly accurate and processed in a lab (which may take a couple of days for test results). **Positive Antigen test results** are also highly accurate; **Negative Antigen test results** may need confirmation via Viral PCR test. Rapid Antigen tests take about 15 minutes for results.

Steps to Follow for COVID-19 Testing

1 CHECK FOR SYMPTOMS

The most common symptoms of COVID-19 are fever of >100.4°F, cough, shortness of breath, or difficulty breathing.

Other symptoms may include chills, repeated shaking with chills, muscle pain, headache, sore throat, or new loss of taste or smell.

If you have danger signs, such as trouble breathing, pain or pressure in chest, confusion or inability to arouse, or bluish lips or face, call 911.

Anyone experiencing symptoms without danger signs, especially those who are over 65 years old, pregnant, have a serious medical condition, like diabetes, or are in another high-risk category, continue to step 2.

Most people who get COVID-19 recover on their own at home.

If you have a positive test for COVID-19, or have not been tested and have symptoms of respiratory illness, stay home and avoid contact with others; wear a mask when around others; wash hands frequently; disinfect surfaces regularly; and inform close contacts you are sick.

2 GET SCREENED

If you have a doctor: Schedule an appointment to be screened in person or online. To protect others, do not visit your doctor without calling first.

If you don't have a doctor or insurance: Call one of the test sites or clinics in this document.

If you are screened, and the doctor determines you don't have COVID-19, follow your doctor's guidance.

If you are screened and need a test, the doctor or clinic will schedule an appointment for you or refer you to a testing site. Many sites offer drive-up and walk-up testing options.

Who Should Get Tested: Get tested if you have any of the common symptoms or you have spent 15 minutes or more within 6 feet of someone who has COVID-19. COVID-19 can occur with mild symptoms, severe illness, or no symptoms at all. Getting tested for COVID-19 will better enable you to take care of yourself while sick and allow you to protect friends and loved ones from the illness. **Many testing sites require pre-screening or a doctor's order, and most require appointments.**

3 GIVE A SAMPLE

There are two types of diagnostic tests—viral and antigen—which have different ways of detecting the virus. The viral PCR test is the most accurate and involves taking a swab of the nose or mouth.

4 RECEIVE RESULTS

You will be notified when the results are available.

While waiting for results, it's important that you stay home and stay away from others and wear a mask when social distancing is difficult.

If you have COVID-19, you will receive further guidance to help protect yourself and others and to identify your close contacts.
