#### FOR PARENTS. RELATIVES. AND CAREGIVERS

Travel for family or relatives to visit youth and formal supervised visitation (Routine and Atypical) (PV) Examples include:

- Airfare and Lodging when a parent/caregiver lives outside of Virginia
- Cab for uncle who resides in Arlington
- Support to maintain foster parent/youth connection for placement sustainability and child well-being

## Travel for parents/relatives/caregivers to attend behavioral health appointments for youth (PB)

### Examples include:

- Mother travels to Community Services Board for weekly family therapy
- Father travels to a local provider for bi-weekly family therapy

## Travel for parents/relatives/caregivers to attend medical appointments for youth (PM)

#### Examples include:

- Annual physical and vision appointments
- Routine dental appointments
- Physical or Occupational Therapy appointments

## Travel for parents/relatives/caregivers to attend court hearings and court related appointments (PC)

#### Examples include:

- Probation hearings
- Permanency and family court hearings
- CHINS petition

## Transportation for parents/relatives/caregivers to attend team meetings (PTM)

## Examples include:

- Family Partnership Meetings
- Family Assessment and Planning Team Meetings
- IEP Meetings

#### **CONSIDERATIONS**

\*When requesting transportation assistance, remember to include **WHY** it is needed, **HOW** it will support the youth's Foster-Care/Permanency Goal, **WHO** the request is for, and WHERE those individuals will be transported. (Example: Why: Back-up transportation in the event public transportation is unavailable such as mechanical/weather related issue How: Independent Living is the youth's goal and employment is an important part of independence. Who: Youth needs transportation Where: To work.)

<sup>\*</sup>Remember to connect transportation to the youth's CANS score and goal.

<sup>\*</sup>Enrichment includes activities such as summer enrichment courses, participation in soccer practice, and marching band trips.

<sup>\*</sup>Back-Up Transportation is not daily or frequent, re-occurring transportation. It is utilized under a special circumstance where the typically available resource is unexpectantly not available.
