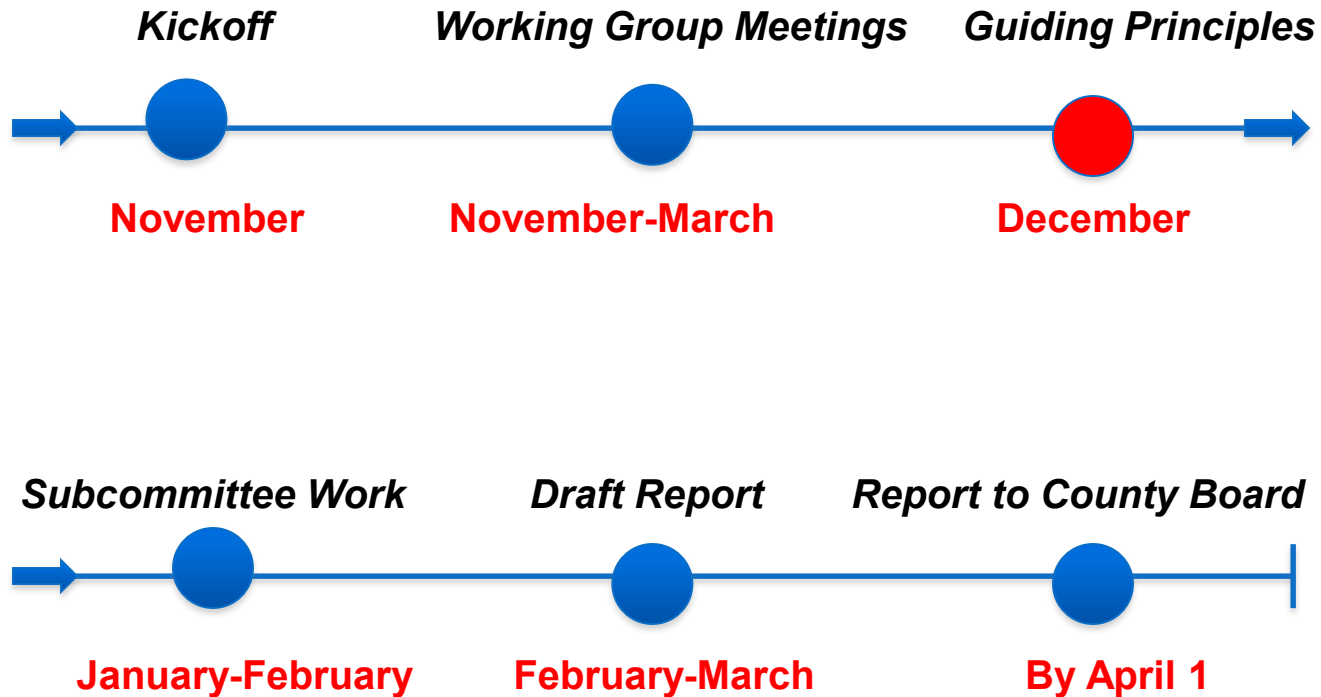

Guiding Principles

What Has Bound Us Together?

- A vote by the County Board to create the Task Force and appoint its members
- Organizations and areas
- The desire to make Arlington a great community

Guiding Principles Should:

- Guide what we do and to some degree how we do it.
- Express to ourselves and the public the content of, and how deliberations will occur and what will guide decision-making.
- Help us stay within our charge and scope.

The Principles:

- Are not intended to constrain decision-making.
- Are intentionally broad.
- Are not independent, but overlap in many ways.
- At times, could conflict, which make information gathering and judgment critical.
- Serve as the foundation of consensus building.



DRAFT Guiding Principles

GUIDING PRINCIPLE

WHY IT'S IMPORTANT

Evaluate current and future capabilities and requirements regarding county-wide winter storm response services, mulch distribution, leaf collection/storage, and other potential operational or community uses of the site.

Need to understand what services and needs exist and what's needed so the TF can make fully informed decision and master plan. Will help ensure operational service delivery and planning alignment is considered and that non-county entities are included in the process.

Evaluate the environmental design and conservation of the site, assess opportunities to enhance recreation, and develop sustainable and creative solutions associated with a park(s)/open space for the site.

Need to balance environmental sensitivity with recreational needs by considering topography, vegetation/trees, site constraints, design features, accessibility, character, usefulness and aesthetics.

Evaluate the appropriate balance between needs county-wide/needs of other entities, and neighborhood preferences for each operational and park/open space element, while also assessing the operating and capital costs associated with each element.

Neighborhood considerations and impact should be fully understood to make decisions; county-wide and larger community needs should also be fully understood. Recommendations must have an associated cost to be reasonably considered by policy makers.

The Task Force will actively and constructively communicate and work with one another, county government and the public in a civil, respectful and reasonable manner.

The Task Force will be more effective if its business is conducted in an open, civil and consensus-building manner.

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
