

This is a summary of the program purpose in the proposed RPP program.

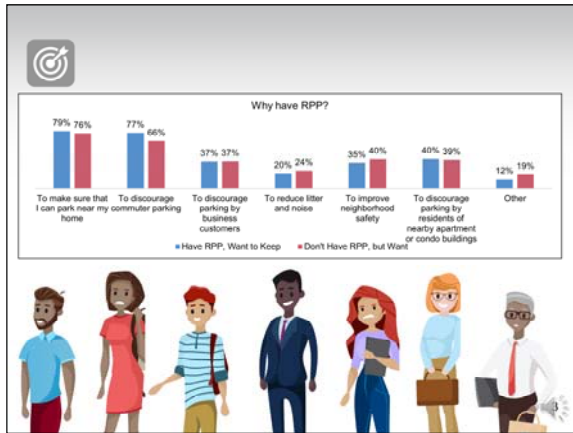


Current Program:

Arlington County created its Residential Permit Parking program to prevent commuters from parking in residential neighborhoods.

However, for decades, the RPP program has also excluded at least some residents from requesting RPP restrictions or permits.

Today, RPP restrictions are granted when parking is hard to find, and a certain percentage of vehicles parked on street are not registered to the area.

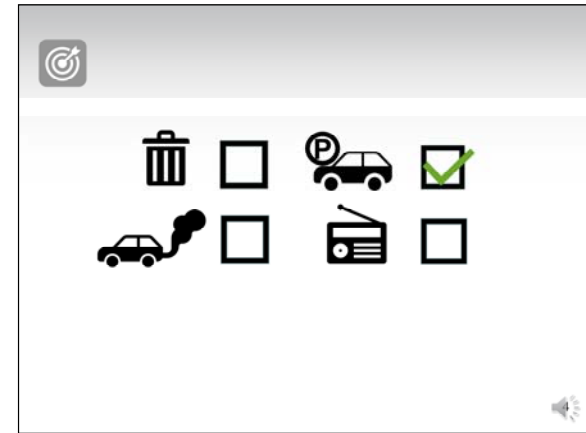


What We Learned:

During this review of the RPP program, we learned that most residents who live in RPP zones valued the program for keeping commuters from parking on their streets and ensuring that there was parking available near their homes, in general.

A large minority of residents who want to get RPP restrictions or keep the restrictions that they have want them to keep residents of apartments and condos from parking on their streets.

A small portion of residents who live in RPP zones or who want RPP restrictions wanted restrictions to reduce litter or noise associated with people parking on their street.



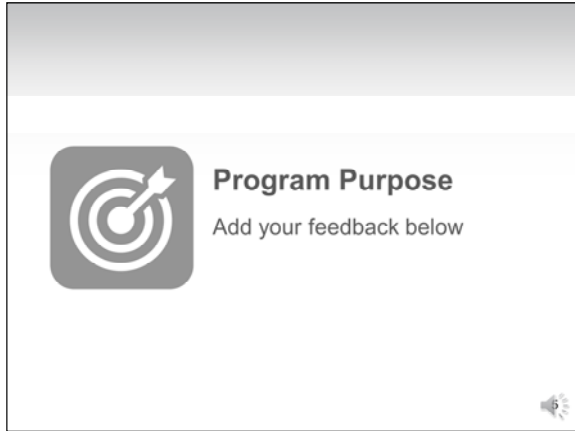
Proposed Program:

In the proposed program, staff would re-affirm that RPP is in place to manage parking demand only.

Why We're Proposing This:

Staff reached this conclusion because there is no comprehensive plan guidance for the use of the RPP program for reasons other than parking availability.

While the Arlington County Code refers to issues like litter, air pollution, and others in the intent language for the RPP program, these are mentioned as side benefits.
