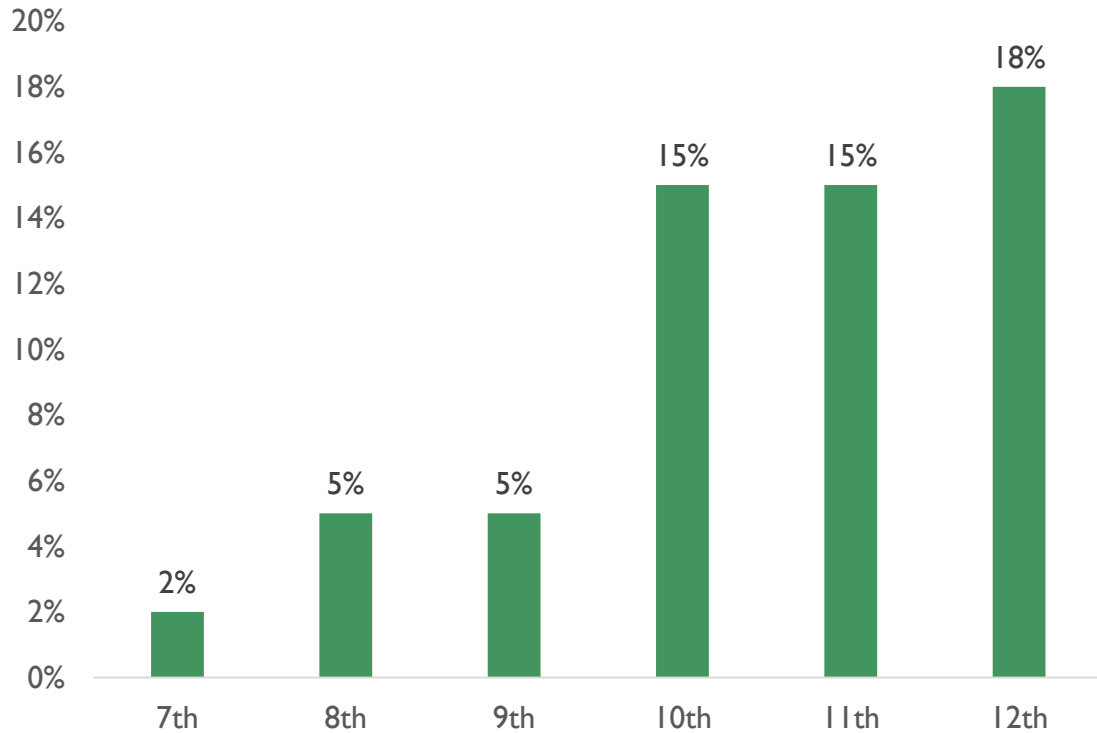
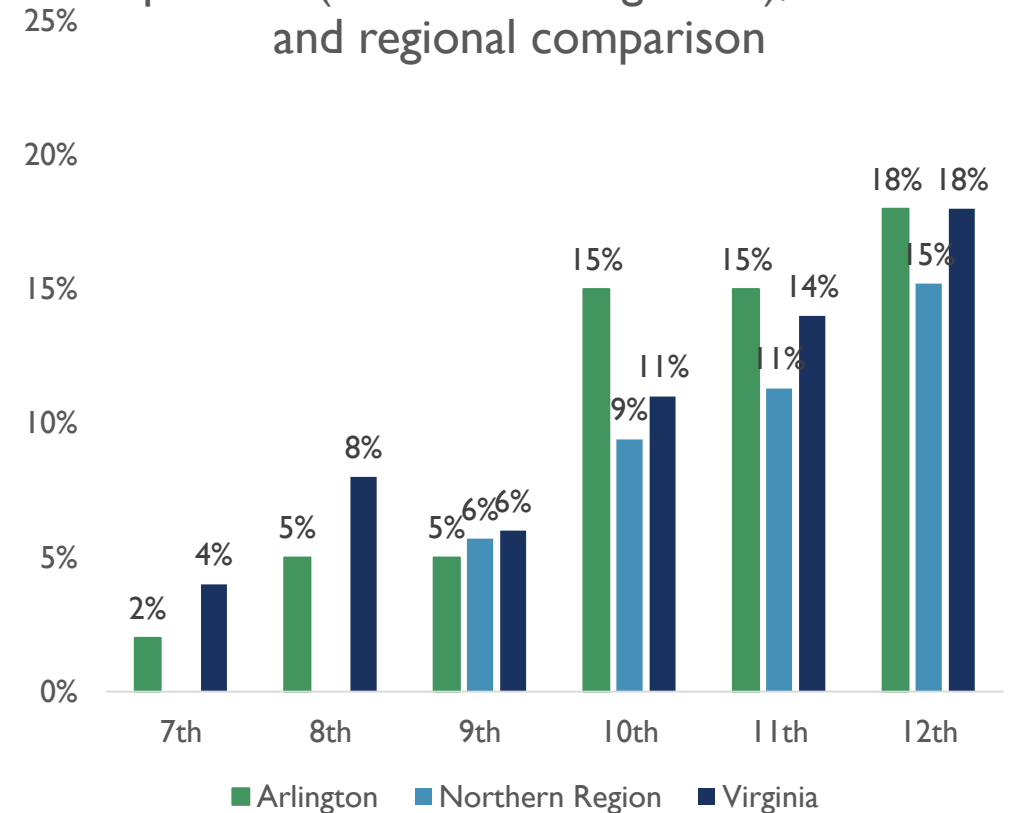


In Arlington, Middle School youth are using e-vapor products at a lower rate than at the state level. However, in High School, more youth are using in Arlington than throughout the state and region in 10th and 11th grade, and higher than region in 12th grade.

Current (past 30 days) use of an electronic vapor product (such as an e-cigarette)

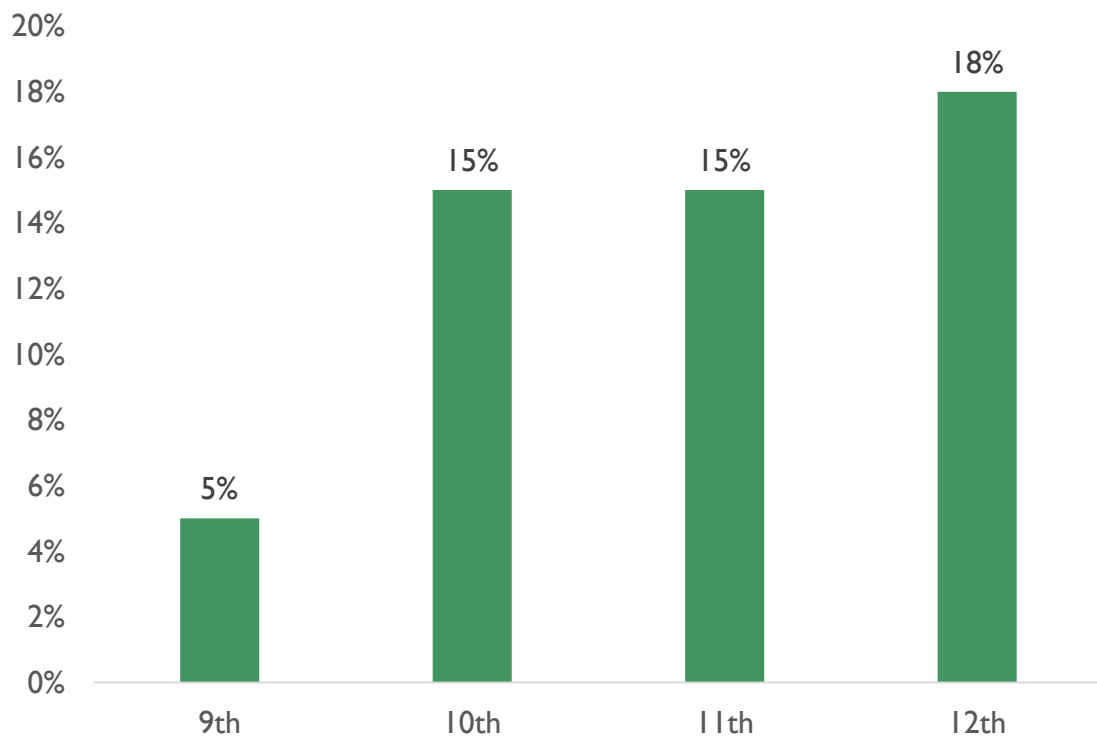


Current use of an electronic vapor product (such as an e-cigarette), state and regional comparison

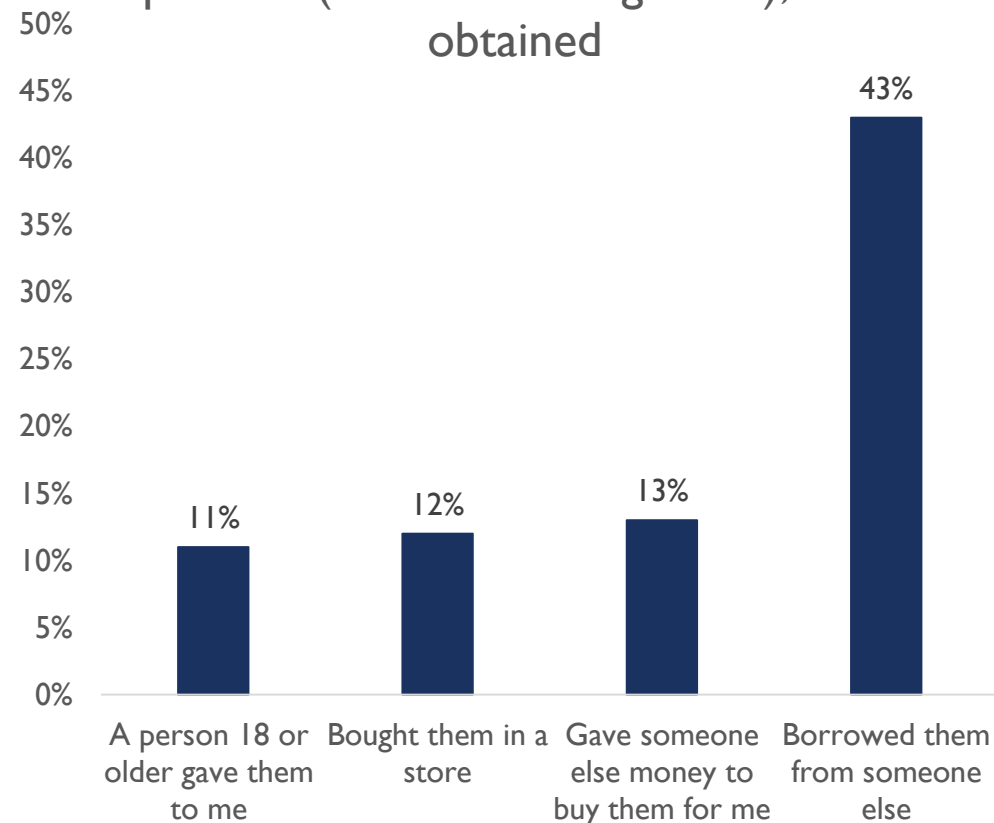


High Schoolers in Arlington, who are current users of e-cigarettes, most often obtained the product by borrowing it from someone.

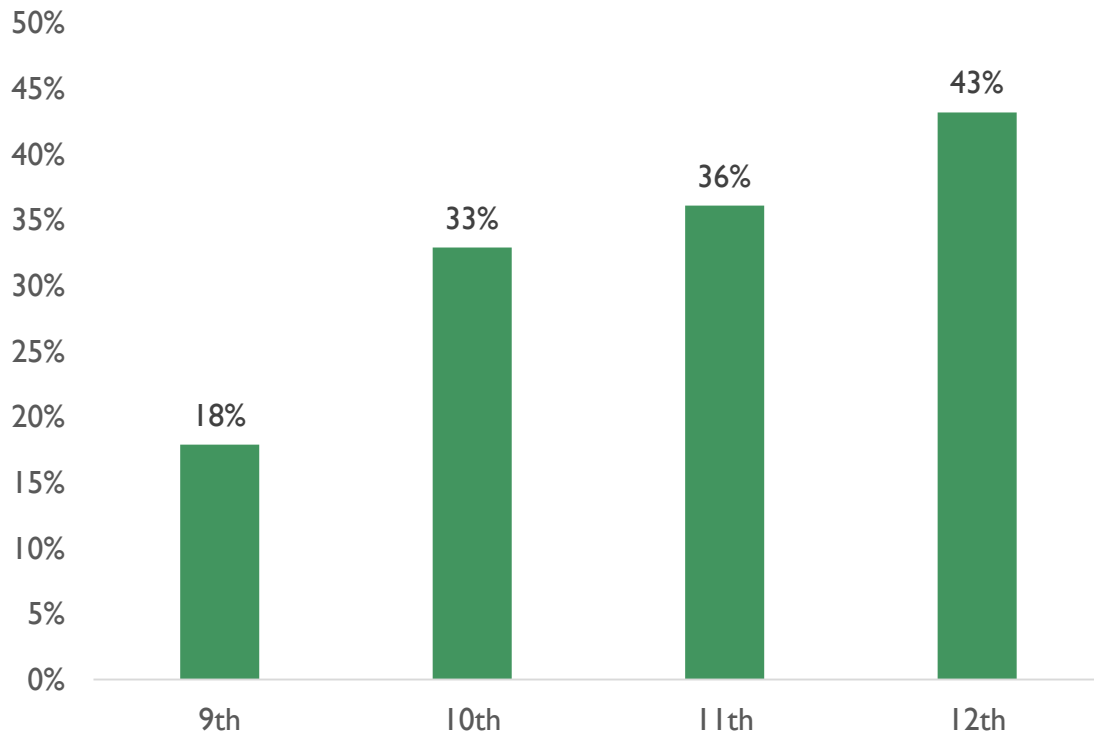


Current use of an electronic vapor product (such as an e-cigarette), how obtained

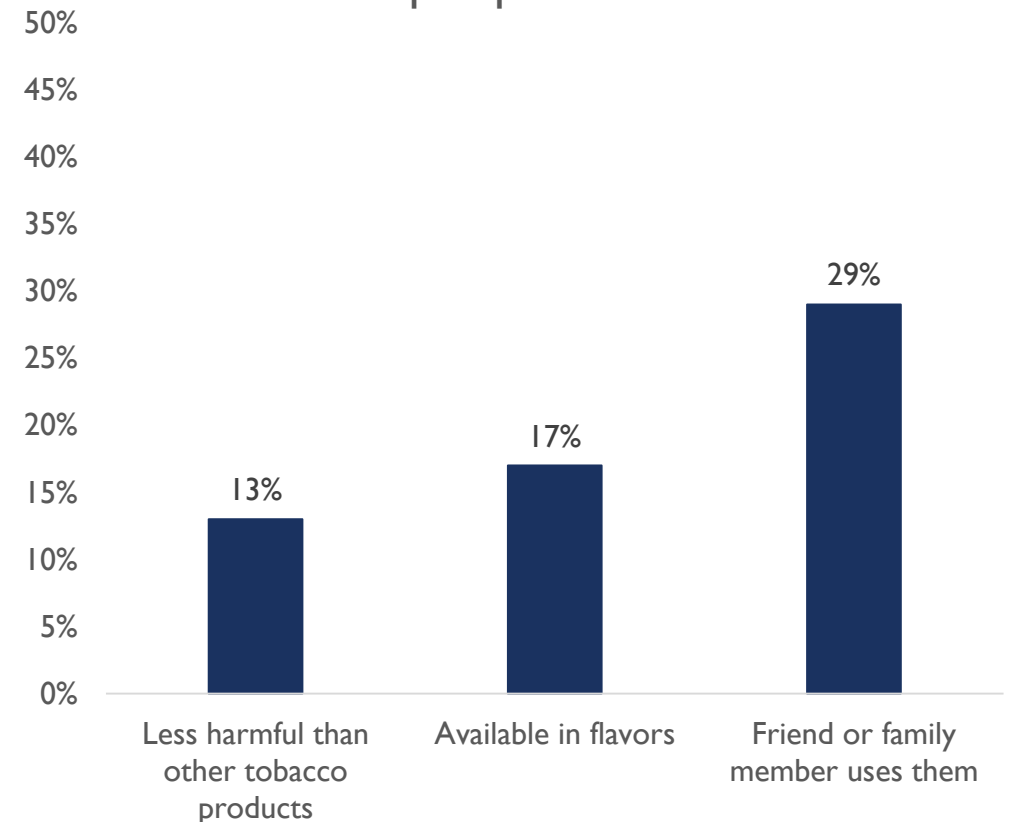


Youth in High School in Arlington report trying electronic vapor products because their friends or relatives are using them.

Ever used an electronic vapor product (such as an e-cigarette)

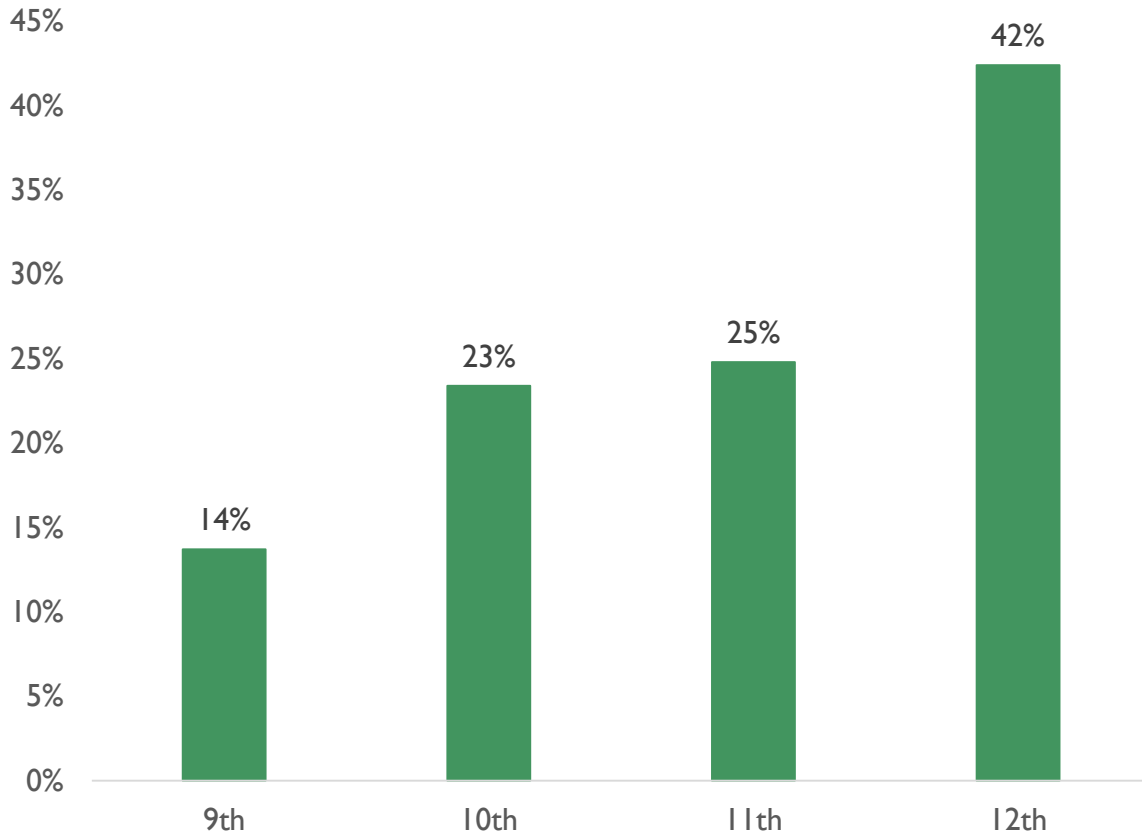


Reasons youth report using electronic vapor products

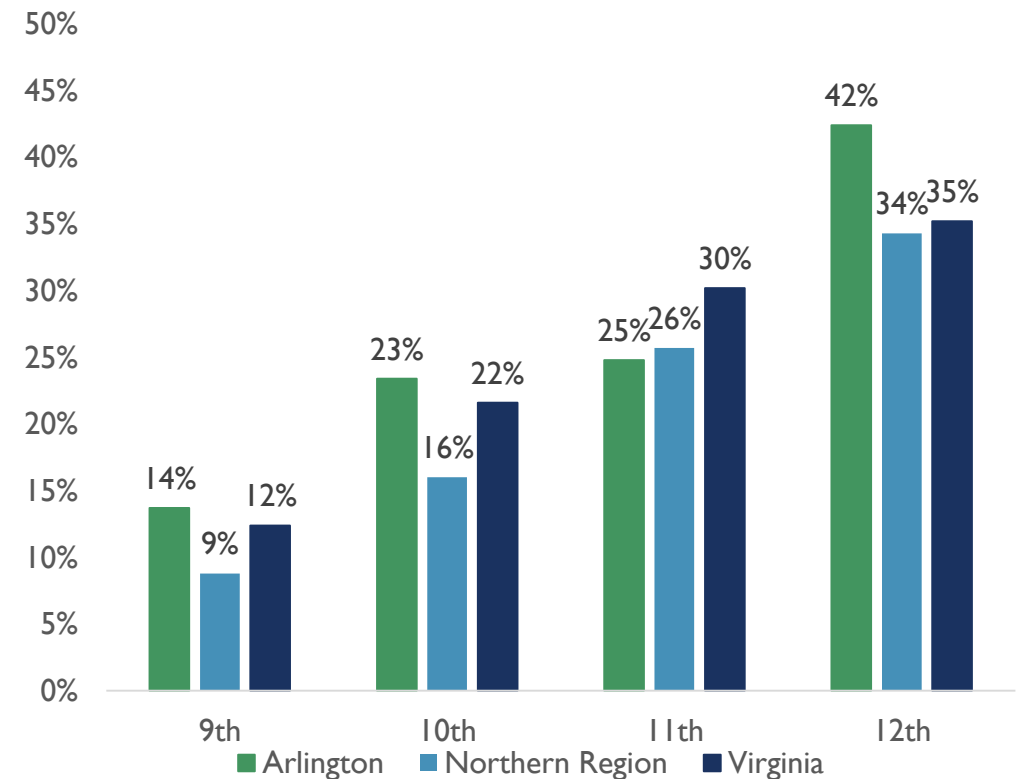


Youth in Arlington report drinking alcohol at a much higher rate than students in the region, particularly in 10th and 12th grade. Senior year, 42% of Arlington youth report drinking at least once during the past 30 days. This is higher than 35% across the state and 34% in the northern region.

During the past 30 days, on how many days did you drink?



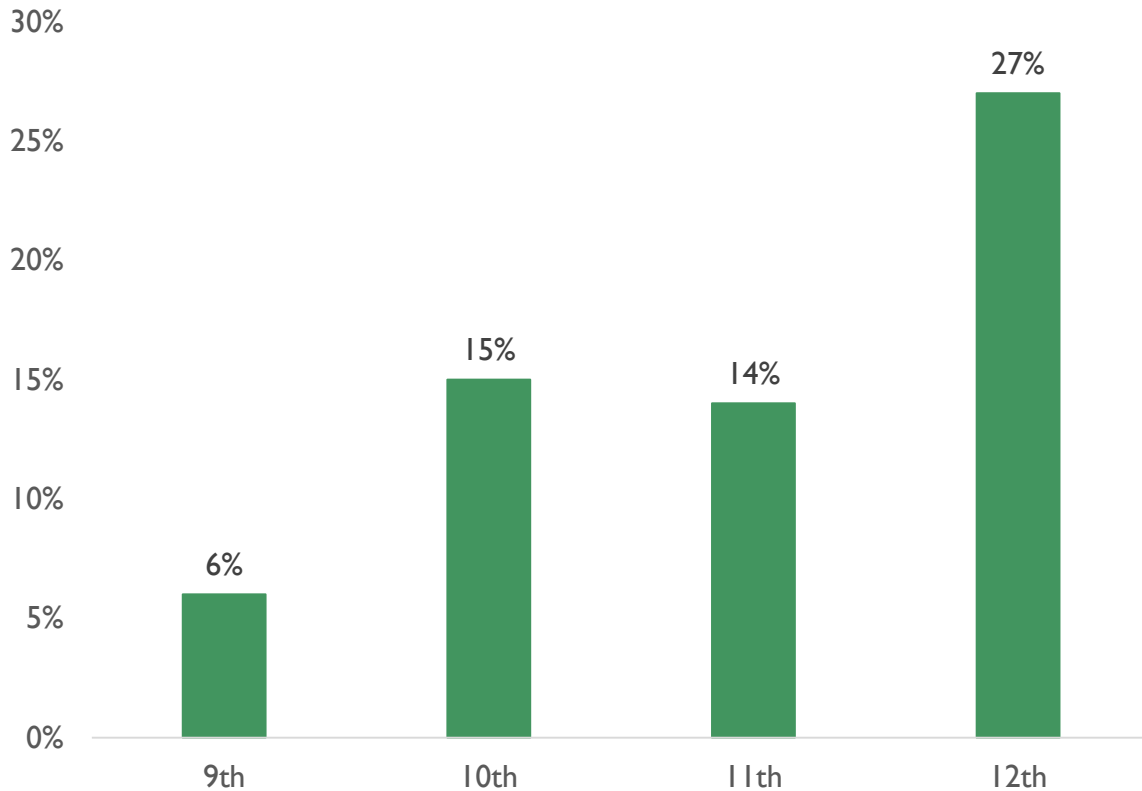
Regular alcohol use, state and regional comparison



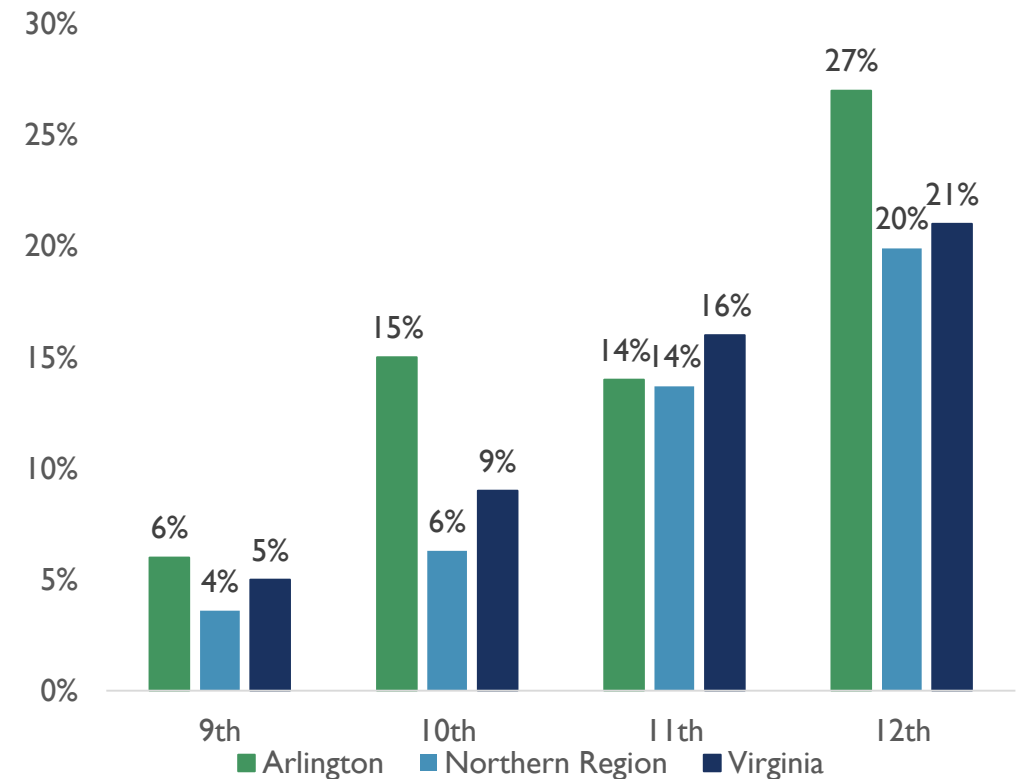
Youth in Arlington report binge drinking at a much higher rate than students in the region, particularly in 10th and 12th grade. Senior year, 27% of Arlington youth report drinking 4 or more (for females) or 5 or more (for males) drinks in a row within a few hours during the past 30 days. This is higher than 21% across the state and 20% in the northern region.

(4 or more drinks for females and 5 or more for males)

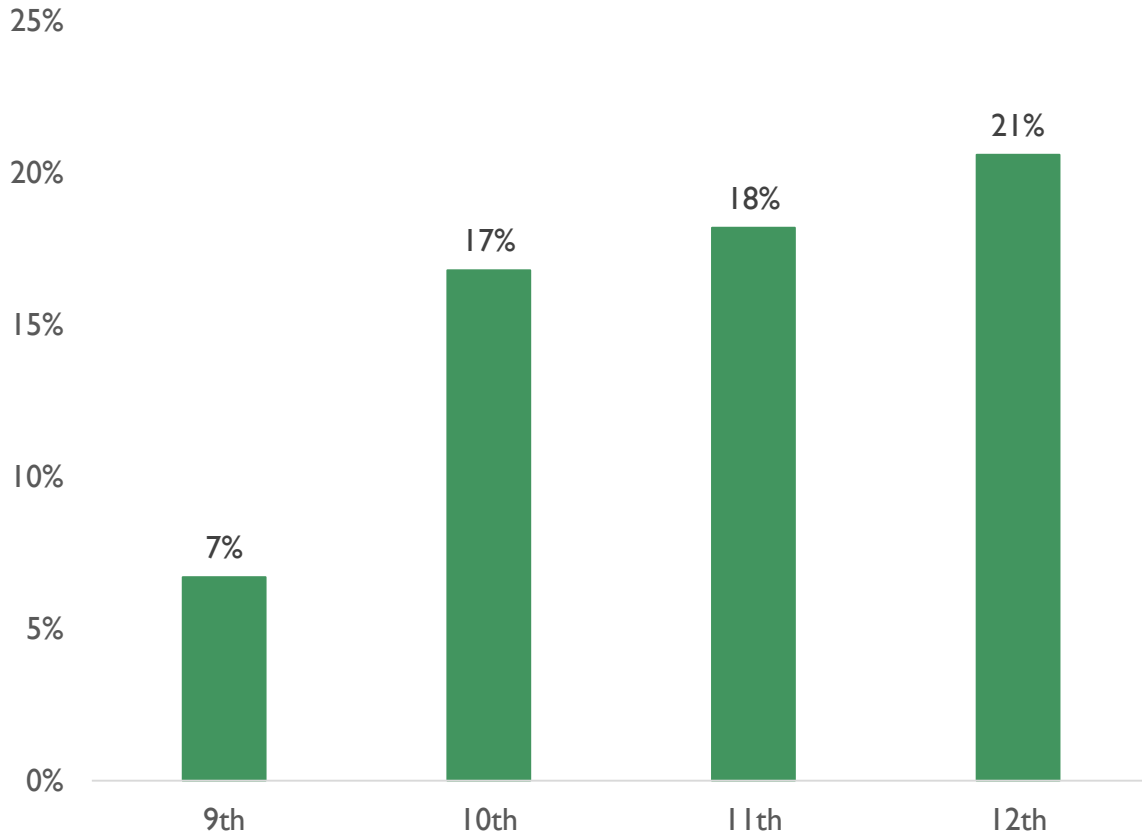


Binge drinking, state and regional comparison

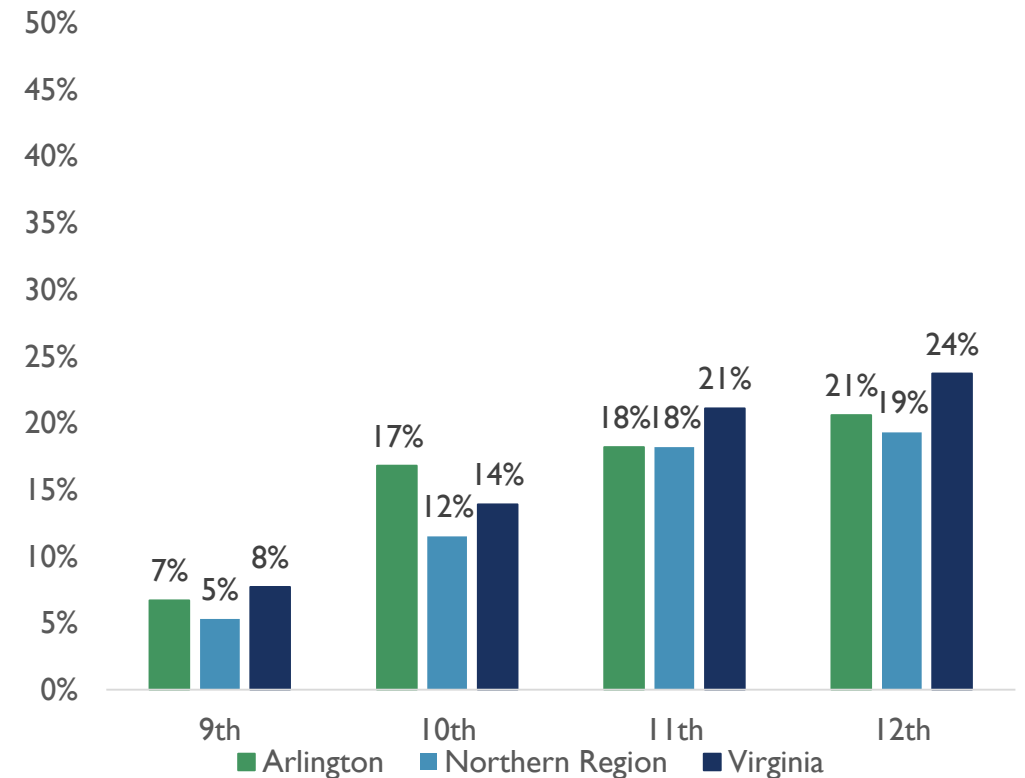


Youth in Arlington report regular use of marijuana at a rate generally comparable to the state and regional usage, within nearly 1/4 of students in 12th grade reporting using marijuana at least once in the past 30 days.

During the past 30 days, on how many days did you use marijuana?

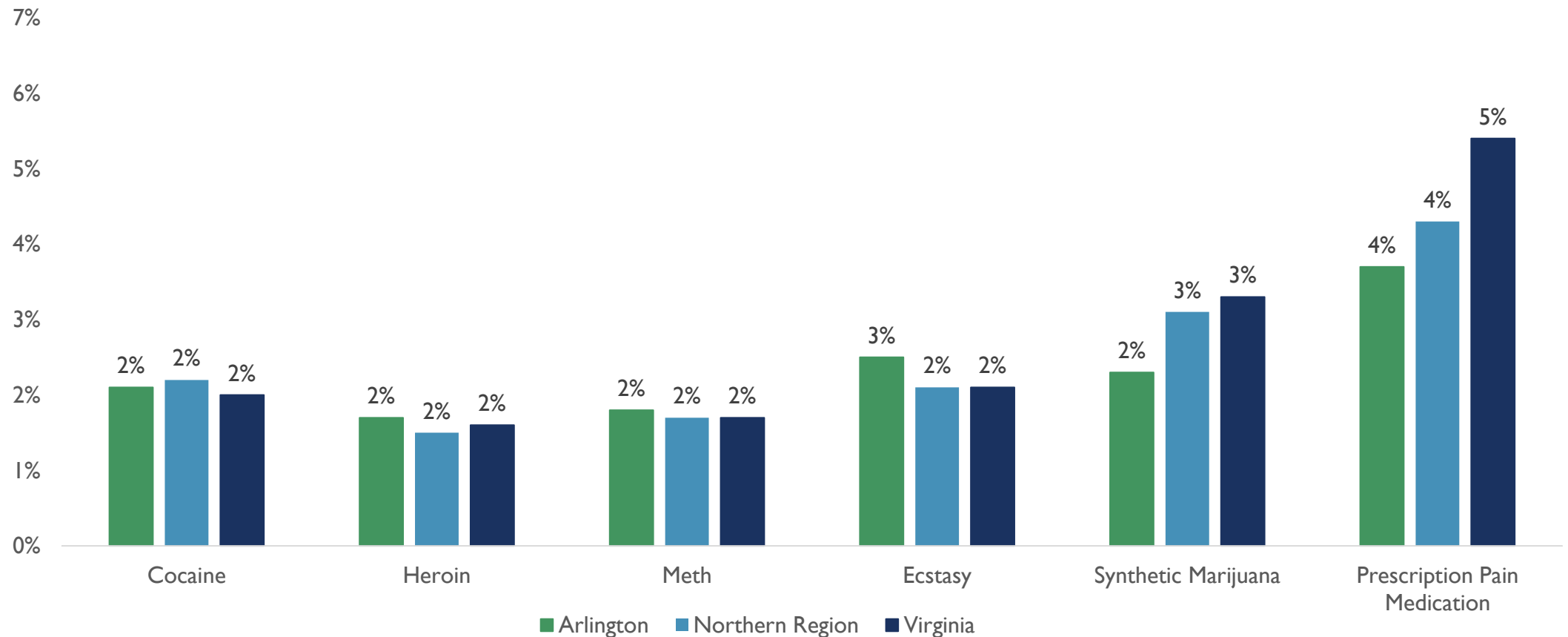


Regular use of marijuana, state and regional comparison



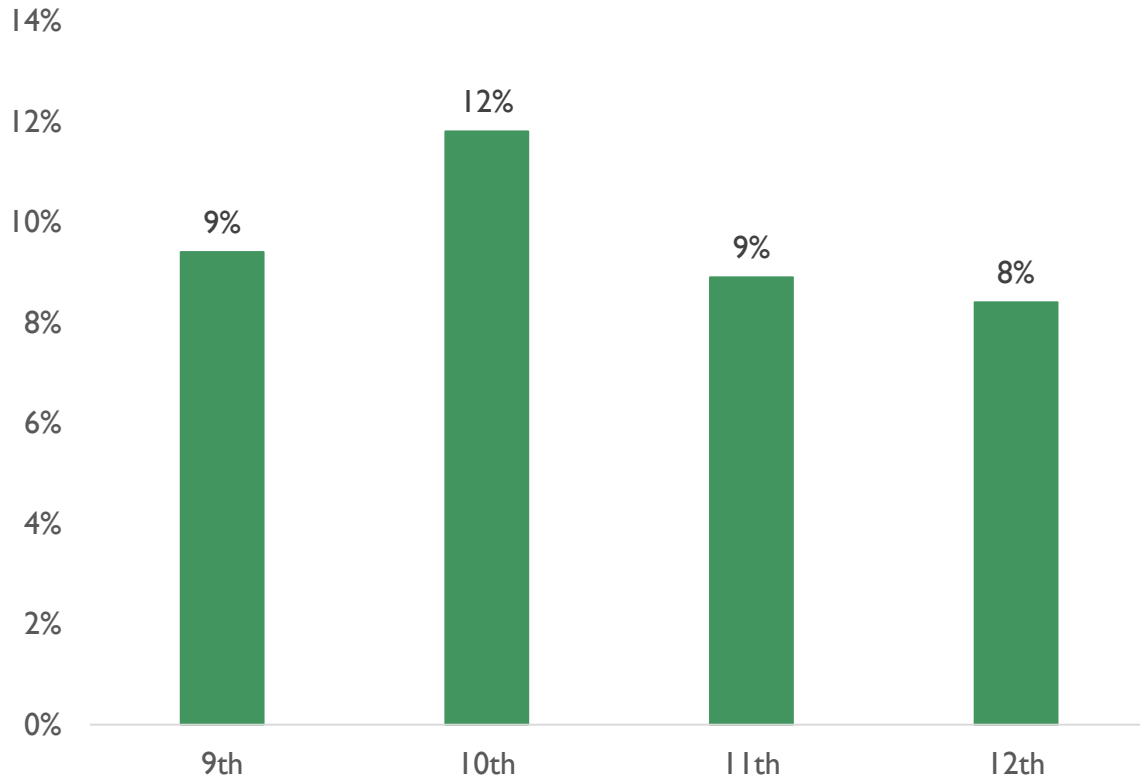
High School age youth in Arlington report regular use of other drugs at a rate generally comparable to the state and regional usage. The drugs most commonly used (other than marijuana) are ecstasy and prescription opioids.
