

LUBBER RUN AMPHITHEATER

Since the construction of the first permanent stage in 1969, generations of Arlingtonians have enjoyed free summer cultural events at the sylvan venue nestled two blocks from Route 50, ranging from Arlington Children's Theater to bands like Eddie from Ohio, Grammy winner Raul Midón and superstar Ritchie Havens.



About the Amphitheater

With a socially distanced capacity of 120 people, Lubber Run Amphitheater (LRA) can host a variety of performing arts events. Bench seating and lawn seating is available, which is ideal for individual attendees or small family groups. Controlled entry to the space allows for pre-registration check-in and health safety screening. Facilities for patrons, performers and crew are available on site. Step-by-step COVID safety planning is included to meet Virginia Health Department guidelines.

Audience and Registration Policies

- As a public resource of Arlington Country, all performances at LRA are free and open to the public. COVID considerations will require pre-registration for all performances. A log of all attendees, staff, and volunteers must be kept for contact tracing purposes for a limited time.
- Up to 120 patrons are allowed in the venue with an additional 15 staff, performers and volunteers.
- COVID self-screenings of all patrons, cast and crew are required before arrival to the venue.
- Facemasks are required for patrons and staff, except for performers while onstage.
- Temperature checks are recommended at check-in.
- All performers must stay 10 feet away from each other and the public during the event, unless they are from the same household. All patrons must maintain a social distance of 6 feet from each other, unless they are from the same household.

Technical Capabilities

- High-tech flexible lighting system includes 10 front flood lights for face light, 10 Source Four side lights for specials and gobo patterns, and 10 LED color changing PARs that cover the entire stage.
- Digital sound system includes a Midas M32 mixer, Midas DL32 stage box, 2 D&B Ci90 speakers, 2 D&B Q Subs, and additional equipment upon request on a case by case basis.
- Technical assistance and crew are available for all performances.


Availability and Scheduling

- To accommodate the demand for more socially distant outdoor events, the 2021 season has a targeted schedule of **May 7 - August 27**, with performances on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday throughout. This schedule is subject to revision pending COVID developments and the guidance of Public Health officials.
- Programming for the season is administered by the Cultural Affairs Division in a direct select process that seeks to represent a diverse range of expression across discipline and culture. For questions about how your organization can be considered for the upcoming season, please see contact information below.
- All performing groups must submit a safety proposal, along with a seating chart (attached) for approval by Cultural Affairs and Arlington Public Health. The proposal must include details about the performance and the safety measures that will be taken to protect the public, performers and crew during the event.
- Rain delays and cancellations are made at the discretion of the Cultural Affairs Division using real-time weather data and on-site reports. Scheduling and resource constraints do not allow for rain dates.
